We're coming to the end of our third week of term 4 which means we've only got seven weeks of the school year remaining. We want all of our tamariki to focus hard on their learning so that they can achieve the learning goals that are appropriate for their age and stage. Helping at home with maths, basic facts, spelling words and ensuring our tamariki do some reading most nights are really helpful things.

Planning for next year is a big focus for us at the moment. We're excited about the appointment of our new principal Mr Josh Te Aomarere and are working hard to ensure Allandale School is all prepared for his arrival next year. Getting our classes organised is always a big job as we strive to balance our class year groups, boys and girls, tamariki who work well together and so on. The Ministry of Education provides us with a certain number of teachers and we have to make things work within that allocation. We value our whānau input into this process. If there is something we need to consider for the placement of your child please fill in the form included with this newsletter and return it to school. This must be done by Friday 3rd November. Things like other children who work well with your child or who are best separated is often a consideration, siblings who are best together or separated and so on. For those who responded to our request to be in one of our Māori Medium Immersion classes (Te Puna Reo) last term thank you, you don't need to do this again. Please note, this is not an opportunity to select your child's teacher. The final decision on placement lies with the school and we expect whānau to respect this.


As our ancestors have told us - Tē tōia, tē haumatia

At this time of the year some children get really anxious about the upcoming changes in their schooling, especially Year 6s who are off to intermediate. We're lucky here in Whakatane as Whakatane Intermediate works really hard to ensure that the transition to intermediate is a smooth one. Please let us know if there is anything

we can do to help your tamaiti if you have any concerns.

Attendance at school matters, every day matters. Our goal is to have our children here at school, learning, at least 90% of the time. That means a child is away on average no more than 1 day each fortnight. As you can see from the graph below this week we fell just short of this target again, with 86% attendance. Monday was a holiday but last Friday we had 43 children away without a good reason. Please remember to report your child's absence if they're away. If they're not at school they're not learning. Let's see if we can get 90% or more next week.
