Yesterday we farewelled our very excited senior students as they departed for Tui Ridge Park for their biannual camp. Once again, thanks to the parents and staff members who have made this wonderful experience a reality for our children. We look forward to seeing everyone home, safe and sound tomorrow.

Next week we will be practising our lockdown procedures. We might lock down our school for a variety of reasons like the close proximity of a dangerous dog or other animal, a civil disturbance, a gas leak, or being directed to do so by the police or district council. Whether it is a real lockdown or a practice, please don't come to school. We've got great systems which we're practising to ensure your children are safe here with us. We'll be working with the appropriate authorities in a real emergency situation to keep our kids safe and extra adults at the school just makes things harder for us and compromises the safety of everyone.

Sometimes communication is tricky! We want our children to attend school every day it's open, as kids who attend school regularly learn best. (There's a bit more on this in the newsletter below) However, we don't want children to come to school if they're unwell. That's not good for the child and it risks spreading the illness to other people at school which is not cool. How do you know whether to keep your child home or not? Here's a guide from From Te Whatu Ora Health New Zealand

- Healthy young children can have up to 8 to 12 colds or upper respiratory tract infections each year and these are a normal part of childhood.
- A child should stay at home if they appear unwell or they develop one or more of these symptoms: sore throat, cough, fever, vomiting, diarrhoea, rash, they are off their food and drink or show signs of feeling miserable.
