

Be aware that you can withdraw your child from all or part of relationships and sexuality education. The guideline from the Ministry of Education website on this is to "write to your school's principal and request that your child is excluded from all or from any particular part of relationships and sexuality education. If you want to do this, it is important that you have a good understanding of what will be taught and why, so it is a good idea to talk to your child's teacher first."

Attendance at school matters, every day matters. Our goal is to have our children here at school, learning, at least 90% of the time. That means a child is away on average no more than 1 day each fortnight. We're pretty much stuck on that 84% - 85% mark. Let's see if we can get to 90% next week. Only 2 weeks left to achieve that this year!


